


EXAMPLE OF TUNNEL FURNACE PROGRAM TEMPERATURE CONTROL

Conference on "Green Opportunities in the Face of Credit Crunch"

Abstract of speech by TEEAM President, Engr Fu Wing Hoong at the Opening of the Conference which was held on 15th July 2009 at Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

A very good morning.

TEEAM together with AFEEC and FAPECA are glad to host this international conference on "Green Opportunities in the Face of Credit Crunch".

Today's event is part of an important crossborder activities of TEEAM, AFEEC and FAPECA to collaborate, exchange views, mutual recognising and networking to promote solidarity and to help the electrical industry move forward.

Before I go further, allow me to introduce AFEEC and FAPECA for the benefit of those who might wonder what they mean.

AFEEC stands for ASEAN Federation of Electrical Engineering Contractors. It was formed in 1979 by five ASEAN electrical industry associations from Indonesia, Philippines, Malaysia, Singapore and Thailand which represent a good cross-section of the various entities in their respective countries in the Asean region engaging in the electrical engineering and contracting business.

Whereas FAPECA stands for Federation of Asian Pacific Electrical Contractors Associations which was founded in 1986. FAPECA's membership encompasses a much larger geographical location over the whole of Asian & Pacific whose members comprise the electrical contracting associations from countries such as Korea, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, USA, Mexico and ASEAN through AFEEC.

The topic today is timely and it is hoped that it can help stimulate your minds to search for opportunities at this time of credit crunch. The word "green" is always loosely defined and is a word commonly used to represent "environment friendly". Here today "green" to me basically points to anything that will help in sustainable development or will help sustain and heal our mother earth, with a focus on energy, particularly those related to our electrical industry.

While the Asian financial crises which hit us in the mid 1997 were said to be caused by the unsustainable development in our region, the unsustainable American Housing Industry was the cause of the recent American financial crises which immediately manifest itself into a world wide credit crunch situation. The world suddenly find themselves short of fund to roll over and many businesses are caught short of cash and are forced into liquidation and even some national economy like Iceland share the same predicament.

Before the collapse of the commodity market, commodity prices were surging like never before and were recording new heights. The reason given was also "unsustainable" development which resulted in scarcity of resources thereby pushing up prices.

All of us know that our mother earth today is in pain and the main reason is the rate at which human exploits the earth. Our mother earth cannot heal herself fast enough. If nothing is done, the consequence is human race will suffer through earth's collapse which may hit us through natural disasters such as earth quakes, Tsunamis, floods, disease, fire and may be even sudden sinking of huge land mass.

The keyword here is "sustainable" and it is important to have sustainable development failing which our future generation might have to bear the consequences.

I believe the recent chain of events and the credit crunch crisis had awakened some nations and reminded them of the need to act immediately to the call for sustainable development and take immediate action and green energy initiative is an important step forward.

Look at America for example, under the Obama's administration, there is a big budget for green energy initiative which American Newspaper had reported to the tune of USD15 billion. Back home in Malaysia, our Malaysian government had taken a big step towards supporting green technology initiative and even named one ministry under a new porfolio called "Energy, Green Technology and Water".

I hope our Malaysian government will continue to increase initiative to push through and play the lead role as the biggest consumer of green technology as we drive towards industrialisation.

Even our private sector, PAM & ACEM had recently launched a Standard for Green Building Index. I congratulate them and believe such initiate will benefit mankind.

Green energy is not a recent technology. It had been around for a long time. If we look around we can find many green technologies, green standards, and a good range of green equipment and products which support the implementation of green projects. The unique feature of all green technologies and green energy products are somehow always linked to high quality, high energy efficiency and is environment friendly.

Thanks must be given to the more advanced countries whose government had the foresight to see through the future and keep nursing the green technology till today. Unfortunately the initial costs of these green



technologies still do not come cheap even though it had dropped considerably. The higher cost is still a big deterrence to the market place.

As the world population becomes more aware of the need to have a sustainable development to save our earth through less wastage and more efficient usages of the earth's resources, the demand for green technology and its related equipment will definitely increase and will create many new business opportunities.

However, due to the high cost of initial investment of green technology today, it is much more difficult for the private sector alone to drive it. This is simply because private sector project cost study may not encompass social impact cost.

Scientists have long ago insisted that the unsustainable development could be one of the main causes of global warming and natural catastrophes. Whenever a natural disaster occurs it causes us huge loss and the government must find ways to prevent such losses.

The government which is responsible for the overall social issues must ensure their social responsibility is taken care of. It will be much cheaper and economical for government to enforce green technology to support sustainable development. It is appropriate that government must be the prime mover of green technology initiative and help to move the private sector towards the right direction in green technology development.

There is no doubt that green energy will be an industry to watch in the near future and 1 hope all trade associations, NGOs, industrialists and all of us should continue to engage their respective government on the importance to initiate sustainable development through promoting and building green energy development for the sake of our next generation.

The conference today may present some very useful insights into green energy and its opportunities. We have some very good papers here today and I hope some of the papers may stimulate your minds into finding green opportunities.





Stamp Duty Order

Through the Treasury Announcement dated 9th September 2009, the Honourable Minister of Finance had agreed, in accordance to his purview under Section 80 (2) of the Stamp Act 1949 that the stamp duty to be imposed on service agreement is at a flat rate of RM 50.00 per agreement during the period of from September 2009 to 31st December 2010. To implement this order, the government has gazetted the Stamp Duty Order (Remittance) 2009 / P.U. (A) 391/2009.

With this gazette, service agreements signed between 15th September 2009 to 31st December 2010 can be stamped at any Inland Revenue Board Stamp Duty Office at a

flat rate of RM 50.00 per agreement without having to obtain approval letter from the Ministry of Finance.

Effective 1st January 2011, ad valorem stamp duty will be imposed at a rate of RM 5.00 per RM 1,000.00 service agreement value. In order to keep the cost of stamp duty to a minimum, companies are advised to break down the percentage of materials cost and services cost. Ad valorem stamp duty is only imposed on the services portion of the agreement. These announcements can be accessed at Treasury website www.treasury.gov.my.
