# **Power Factor Correction Related Issues**

ower Factor (PF) Correction is one of the basic requirements to ensure suffcient voltage level as well as efficient distribution of energy. It is important to note that capacitors do not last very long and with the modern equipment that produces more harmonics currents the life span of each capacitor can be very much shortened. In my past articles I have mentioned about keeping the system voltage at the lower end which had proven to prolong the life span of capacitors. This time we need to address the improvement of PF with the perspective that it is a measure of energy efficiency. Imagine if the required PF is 0.85 which is mandatory and you can improve it to 0.90. There is a 5% increase in the total energy distributed. It is correct to say that this improvement will benefit the electricity supplier but it will also mean that the overall distribution in the area or region will improve and voltage profile can be better

There are two related issues recently encountered and from them we can find solutions and provide improvements to our electricity supply system.

### PF Penalty Imposed on LV Commercial Tariff B

The large number of TNB commercial consumers' meters were not capable of measuring the PF previously. These old meters are being replaced by the modern electronic version and if any consumer's PF is lower than 0.85 a penalty will be imposed.

The electrical appliances and equipment used in these offices do not have good PF individually and there is a high possibility that PF in general will not meet the 0.85 minimum requirement.

Therefore there is a need to address this requirement now. There are obviously two solutions that come to mind. The first is to find out the equipment with low PF and connect the relevant capacitors to provide the compensation. The second is to provide an automatic PF correction board. This will require PF correction relay and a bank of capacitors to be switched in for the purpose. There may be another alternative to have a fixed amount of capacitors to be switched on during office hours only so that PF correction can be provided at a cheaper solution.

It is the TNB which highlighted the above need to TEEAM and I hope we can provide the necessary solutions to those in need.

# PF Penalty Imposed on MV Industrial Tariff E

It is customary for the electrical supervising engineers to advise their clients to look out for any PF penalty in the TNB monthly bills. Previously the low PF penalty is easily noted on the first page of the bill. Since the end of 2008 this format had been slightly altered. It is less obvious to notice the low PF penalty charge on the first page of the bill. The individual items for billing are recorded on page two of the bill.

One of my clients was paying low PF penalty for a few months before noticing them. My monthy visits and visual inspection of the PF meters did not discover the low PF. PF measurement is made by the accumulated KVARH (Kilo Voltage Amperes Reactive Hour) consumed. The reason for the low PF was due to failures of capacitors. The capacitors are only checked once in two years and in this case there were also some new equipment added to the installation. The low PF situation and charges are expected but it will be in the best interest of everyone if the PF reading can be displayed in the bill irrespective of whether any penalty is charged. It will serve as a measure to determine the performance of the PF correction board.

#### **TEEAM's Proposal to TNB on PF**

The above issues were discussed in the TEEAM Council Meeting. We are in the process of making a formal proposal to TNB. The contents will be as below.

The section in JUMLAH KECIL has the following items:

JUMLAH CAJ (Total Charge)
PELARASAN ANGGARAN (Estimated Adjustment)
PELBAGAI CAJ (Various Charges)
PENALTI (Penalty)
BIL SEMASA (Current Bill)
TUNGGAKAN (Arrears)
CAGARAN TAMBAHAN (Additional Collateral)
JUMLAH (Total)
PENGENAPAN (Settling)
JUMLAH YANG PERLU DIBAYAR (Total needs to be paid)

However when there is a surcharge for poor/low power factor it will not be listed with any of the above items. It is listed on the Page 2 of the bill.

The Manager of a plant has the ability to pick up PF surcharge if he reads the entire two pages otherwise he will discover it much later.

It is our opinion that PF surcharge should either be listed or inserted under PELBAGAI CAJ or PENALTI for easier identification.

Further to the above we believe that if the actual monthly PF can be prominently displayed in the bill even if there is no PF surcharge it will prove to demonstrate the efficient use of electricity in the installation. This will also indicate to the client if their PF is descending or getting closer to the limit for surcharge. We may even suggest in the future that high PF in any installation be rewarded with some monetary value.

The above proposal is made on the basis that we can promote Energy Efficiency by encouraging consumers to maintain high PF in their installations.

There is also a request that off peak MD (Maximum Demand) be listed even though this item is not chargeable. Again this will assist the consumer in knowing their actual usage during off peak hours and make the necessary adjustments.

# Is Light Pollution Killing Our Birds?

Colin Henshaw and Graham Cliff believes that light pollution is reducing the numbers of insects on which many birds rely.

In 1994, the Journal of the British Astronomical Association carried a letter from one of the authors (Colin Henshaw) entitled *The Environmental Effects of Light Pollution*. The letter concluded by predicting that the anticipated reduction in the insect population caused by light pollution would affect predators higher up the food chain.

Recent research has shown a reduction in the populations of moths, spiders, sparrows and amphibians, supporting the case for light pollution being considered a threat to the environment as well as to astronomers - who find the glare interfering with their observations - and householders - who complain of the visual intrusion caused by security lights and insensitive street lighting.

It is common knowledge that street and security lights attract insects: indeed, 2000-watt light traps are used by scientists to study insect species in the Brazilian rain forest. The authors think that the increasing numbers of urban street and security lights must have a measurable impact on the environment, as insects fly around the lights all night and eventually fall to the ground exhausted, no longer having the energy to feed themselves or to procreate. Consequently, with lights often left on all night, 365 nights a year, the number of insects must be significantly reduced.

"As a child, I was amazed by the profusion of insects to be seen in the countryside," recalls Colin Henshaw. "But, returning home to Manchester, I noted there were fewer insects."

Considering the number of lights in an average city and the rate at which this number has grown in recent years, they must sweep up

millions of insects every day. So it comes as no surprise to find that many urban and suburban environments are now increasingly sterile as far as insects are concerned


Insects are the primary food source for many predators (such as bats, birds, lizards and frogs), and their decline has a serious knock-on effect for other creatures.

The 1994 letter also pointed out that insects are important pollinators. If their numbers go down, then so too will the number of successful flower pollinations, producing a

vicious circle of decline in the biodiversity of plants. Two facts are worth noting: first, Dr Kelvin Conrad of the Rothamsted Research Centre has remarked that Holland is the most sterile country in Europe; second, Dr P Cinzano of Padua University has produced satellite evidence that, in Europe, light pollution is at its worst in Holland. In the mid 1990's, Colin Henshaw's father commented that he had not seen a thrush in the garden for ten years. Most people in Britain are aware of the decline in the number of house sparrows and that of many other previously common or 'garden' birds. Sparrows, and their hatchlings, had been presumed to

be wholly granivorous but recent research by Dr. Kate Vincent has shown that hatchlings in fact feed on insects (or spiders) to obtain protein, so, if they do not get enough insects when young, they do not survive.

Spiders, too, feed on insects, so if the number of insects goes down, spider numbers will likewise decline. And a discussion of insects cannot overlook recent reports on the populations of

British moths. For instance, the environmental group Butterfly Conservation has found a decline of a third in the larger moth species in Britain since 1968; some have been reduced by as much as 98%.

This decline in moths and sparrows has mirrored the expansion of street lighting in the UK, and elsewhere around the world. As more and more conurbations have leaked out more light into the environment, the effect on the insect population must have been devastating. One German study presented at a symposium in 2003 concluded that a single streetlight would kill, on average, 150 insects per night. Philipp Heck, President of Dark Sky Switzerland, has suggested that the 50,000 or so streetlights left on all night in Zurich kill over 1,000,000 insects per night.

Whether the loss of insects is a direct result of street lighting is yet to be proved conclusively. However, what is not speculative is the cost

of light pollution in money and energy. One 500-watt security light on every night for a year is the source of more carbon dioxide emissions, in the electricity it consumes, than a typical fuel-efficient car being driven more than 8000km.

The current fashion for over-lighting our natural environment has many adverse consequences. Reducing light pollution would save money and energy, improve the environment for us all, and help to return our country's biodiversity to a healthy level. The technology is available to turn off street and security lights when they are not needed:

street-lighting trials in Denmark showed that the capital costs were recouped within a year from the energy savings.

Light pollution is a term used by astronomers to describe an effect that prevents us observing the night sky and, as such, it has come to be regarded as an issue of concern only to anoraks and nerds. However, as evidence from different branches of science comes together, it begins to seem as though the solution to one problem might also be the solution to others.

It seems, then, that the predictions of 1994 are now at last being vindicated. If we wish to see a reversal in the decline of some of our native species of animals, then we should do something to control the light pollution that appears to have had such a hidden, damaging, effect on them. If we are to reverse current trends, something needs to be done before it is too late. Whilst the idea of 'Just In Time' is well and good in industry, we do not want to see 'Just Too Late' in our environment, indeed for our world.



# **Awareness Programme on GST**

The Royal Malaysian Customs Kuala Lumpur Federal Territory organised a half day awareness programme on the introduction of Goods & Services Tax (GST) for consumers on 16th March 2010. The objective of the programme was to introduce the Malaysia GST model and its implications to the consumers as well as to discuss and obtain inputs on consumerism issue in local area. Some TEEAM members attended the event. The programme covered types of tax, model of GST, its mechanism, sample of GST calculation, consumers' roles, government's action and consumer's price guideline. The government has recently announced that GST will be deferred to a later date.

GST is a multi-stage consumption tax levied on goods and services at all levels of business transactions. GST replaces the current sales tax and services tax (SST). GST is aimed at making our taxation system more effective, efficient, transparent and business friendly.

GST is imposed on the value added along the supply chain from manufacturer down to retailer. Production and sales go through several stages of GST collection and payment. Everyone in the supply chain (ie supplier, manufacturer, wholesaler, retailer and consumer) pays GST to their suppliers for the goods or services they purchase and charge/collect GST on the goods/services they sell.

#### Why GST?

GST is a better and fairer tax system compared to SST as GST will:

- Lower business costs Under the current system, some businesses pay multiple taxes and higher levels of tax-on-tax (cascading tax). With GST, businesses can benefit from recovering input tax on raw materials and incurred expenses, thus reducing costs.
- Increase global competitiveness Prices
  of Malaysian exports will become more
  competitive on the global stage as no GST
  is imposed on exported goods and services,
  while GST incurred on inputs can be
  recovered along the supplies chain. This

will strengthen our export industry, helping the country progress even further.

- Enhanced compliance The current SST has many inherent weaknesses making administration difficult. GST system has in-built mechanism to make the tax administration self-policing and therefore will enhance compliance.
- Reduce red tape Under the present SST, businesses must apply for approval to get tax-free materials and also for special exemption for capital goods. Under GST, this system is abolished as businesses can offset the GST on inputs in their returns.
- Equity With GST, taxes are leveled fairly among all the businesses involved, whether they are in the manufacturing, wholesaling, retailing or service sectors.
- Fair pricing to consumers GST eliminates double taxation under SST. Consumers will pay fairer prices for most goods and services compared to SST.
- Greater transparency Unlike the present sales tax, consumers would benefit under GST as they will know exactly whether the goods they consume are subject to tax and the amount they pay for.
- Not subject to GST We do not pay GST on certain goods/services, ie Zero-rated supplies and Exempt supplies.
- Zero rated supplies These are taxable supplies that are subject to a zero rate.
   Businesses are eligible to claim input tax credit in producing these supplies, but cannot charge output tax to the consumer.
- Exempt supplies These are non-taxable supplies that are not subject to GST. Businesses are not eligible to claim input tax credit in producing these supplies, and cannot charge output tax to the consumer.

It was informed that suppliers, manufacturers, wholesalers and retailers will benefit as they are able to recover GST incurred on inputs. This will reduce the cost of doing business thus enabling fairer prices for consumers.

The model of GST imposes on three types of sale, ie standard-rated sales, zero-rated sales and exempt sales. Standard rated sales will be

subject to specific 4% tax and registered persons will be entitled to recover their input tax. Zerorated sales will be subject to 0% tax and will be applied to registered persons who are entitled to recover their input tax. The exempt sale is not entitled to recover on input tax.

GST mechanism allows registered persons to claim back the paid GST on business inputs automatically for taxable sales (ie standard rated sales and zero rated sales). The GST mechanism for transacting business with sales are excluded ie no tax will be collected on the services provided, such as banks cannot recover input tax which has been paid.

GST is to be collected by the person who registered under GST Act. The registration is compulsory if business has annual sales of RM 500,000 or more; and small businesses that annual sales is less than RM 500,000 such as retail shops will be excluded from the GST system and they can sell the goods without charging GST.

Goods exempted from GST includes daily basic foods, such as rice, sugar, flour, cooking oil, salt, spices, vegetables, fish, chicken, meat and egg. Services exempted from GST include electricity supply to domestic consumers for the first 200 kWh and water supply to domestic consumers for the first 35 cubic meters.

Certain basic goods and services are not subject to GST for social-economic objectives. These include basic foods, residential accommodation, education, health services, life insurance/takaful, banking services, public transportation (such as train, LRT, bus, taxi, ferry, boat, highway toll fee) and domestic consumption of water supply and electricity up to a certain limit.

It was informed that more programmes on the GST will be held in the future. TEEAM will be informing members for participation.

# **Tiger in Love**

2010 sees the Golden (Metal) Tiger Chinese New Year coinciding with the Valentine's Day, a combination of two prominent dates, and certainly a happy romantic meeting of the Eastern and Western culture, for once.

Throughout the world, Tiger is the symbol of strength, power, bravery, charm and authority. It is featured in state symbols, including that of Malaysia, in the Coat of Arms. The leading bank in the country, Maybank, the country's first national car, Proton, and the Football Association of Malaysia, all have the tiger as their emblems or logos.

# **Symbol of Power**

For thousands of years, tiger has been part of Chinese civilisation, used by the imperial court right down to the laymen, in myriads of forms and manners with widely varied connotations.

For those in power, its authoritative ranking is only second to the Dragon, as far as social hierarchy is concerned. The Chinese proverb 'Dragon fighting with Tiger' means a clash between the titans, and 'Dragon Soaring and Tiger Jumping' for activity that is hyperdynamic. "Green Dragon White Tiger" is most welcome in the world of fengshui, as it means excellent guard against the evil elements. The box office Chinese movie "Hidden Dragon and Couching Tiger" starred by Chow Yun Fatt and our very own Dato'Michelle Yeoh is of course all too well-known.

To the Chinese, Tiger can also mean severe danger and risk, as in phrases and proverbs such as "Mouth of Tiger" (meaning a highly strategic location or the dangerous crossroads), and "Let tiger return to mountain" (meaning giving freedom to a dangerous enemy). A high-handed government is described by the proverb "An oppressive government is worse than a tiger", while "A mountain cannot house two tigers" means that there can only be one decision maker in a power entity.

In the wild as well as the society, many things that are fearsome are also affixed with the word 'tiger': freshwater tiger (for toman – the top predatory fish in Malaysian lakes and

rivers), tiger general (for superb fighters), female tiger (for fearsome wife), and paper tiger (weakling who pretends to be strong). However, for some interesting reasons, the common lizard is called 'Wall Tiger', even though it is quite harmless.

On the other hand, the tiger also has its gentle sides of characters, as depicted in popular proverbs such as 'Even a fierce Tiger will not eat its young'. However, such similes are few and rarely used.

# **Tiger Outlook**




### EXAMPLE OF TUNNEL FURNACE PROGRAM TEMPERATURE CONTROL






