Message from **TEEAM President**

0 years is a significant milestone for TEEAM. From a humble beginning in the 50s, TEEAM Ohas over the years established a good rapport and reputation and is now well recognised by the government and private sectors. TEEAM is consulted when the government formulates regulations and policies. I am proud to note that we now have a better standing in voicing industry's concerns over some key policy matters.

TEEAM has participated in the steering committee to contribute inputs in the formulation of the Construction Industry Payment Adjudication Act (CIPAA) 2012 which was gazetted on 22nd June 2012 recently. The Act provides alternative dispute resolutions to arbitration and litigation which are time consuming and often expensive. CIPAA will also ensure timely payment for the benefit of our members, which will be a great relief for the electrical construction industry. Towards this end, TEEAM appreciates CIDB's effort in driving the CIPAA to be gazetted.

TEEAM is facilitating the Department of Skill Development in the development of the National Occupational Skills Standard (NOSS) which will be used as reference document for the development of skill training modules to upgrade the skill of workers. Members may voice to the association on the NOSS needed to be developed where skills are lacking.

We are also participating actively in the Ministry of Energy, Green Technology and Water's work groups in drafting the Energy Efficiency & Conservation Law. The Law requires us to be more efficient when using energy and practise energy conservation which will lead to a greener Malaysia and a healthier environment.

As an NGO which is concerned about environmental issue, TEEAM is participating in an energy saving compact fluorescent light (CFL) recycling project. Mercury is a very harmful substance and used CFL bulbs are collected for proper disposal. The public will be given incentive for returning the used CFL bulbs for recycling. This might not be the best way to dispose them for now but at least it is a good start.

To better reflect the changing times, TEEAM has also updated its Constitution. In this respect, the incorporation of the Honorary Fellow membership is meant to help promote and advance TEEAM's agenda by drawing the expertise of industry experts of good standing. The formalisation of EXCO members' roles and responsibilities is done to complement the work of the Council. This will be a very important decision making body that helps to make day-to-day decisions on association matters for greater efficiency.

Last but not least, I wish to express my appreciation to the Diamond Jubilee Dinner Organising Committee for their wonderful effort in making this dinner a success and so memorable. My heartiest thanks must also go to our dinner sponsors for their generous contribution and ardent support. Background

he Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM) is a representative body of the electrical and electronics industries in Malaysia. TEEAM was established in 1952 and it aims to work closely with all government departments, statutory bodies and the private sector to ensure and promote orderly growth and development of the electrical and electronics industries.

TEEAM is officially represented in the various relevant government bodies' Council and Committees such as the Ministry of Energy, Green Technology and Water (KeTTHA), Department of Skills Development (DSD), Energy Commission (EC), Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB), Standards Malaysia and SIRIM Berhad. TEEAM is an appointed Standards Wiring Organisation (SWO) for electrical and electronics products/services. Besides, TEEAM is also represented in the Asean Consultative Committee for Standards & Quality (ACCSQ) Joint Sectoral Committee on Electrical & Electronics Equipment (JSC EEE).

TEEAM is accredited by CIDB to conduct building wiring installer training course. TEEAM has international affiliation through its membership in the Asean Federation of Electrical Engineering Contractors (AFEEC). In a broader spectrum, TEEAM is also affiliated to the Federation of Asia-Pacific Electrical Contractors Associations (FAPECA) through AFEEC's membership in FAPECA.

Membership

Membership of TEEAM is drawn from companies, individuals as well as state associations engaged in the electrical and electronics industries in Peninsular and East Malaysia. To date, TEEAM has approximately 1,720 members and they are classified according to their business activities, i.e. Engineering Construction and Services, Trading and Manufacturing.

Aims & Objectives of TEEAM

- To promote and co-ordinate throughout the country the development of the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services by members of TEEAM with a view to contributing effectively to the economic development of the country.

- To identify and study problems arising in the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services and to discuss these problems with, and/or bring them to attention of:
 - Government and Quasi-Government Agencies, through the relevant Ministries, Departments and Agencies.
 - Architects, engineers, quantity surveyors and/or other consultants through their relevant institutions or associations.
- To promote the legitimate interest of members, in particular to discuss and negotiate with government departments and agencies, institutions and other consultants on matters pertaining to policy, finance, legislation, technical standards, administration of contracts and procedure of registration which affect the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services.

- To seek representation on committees/councils/boards set up by government or non-government organisations concerning the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services.
- To encourage and promote the practice of professionalism in the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services by the members of TEEAM.
- To encourage and participate in educational programmes relevant to the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services.
- To organise and manage seminars, symposiums and conferences for the dissemination of knowledge, directly or indirectly connected with the electrical and electronics trade, industry and services and to promote fellowship amongst such firms / persons.
- To seek and maintain affiliation with other organisations or associations, where such affiliation is consistent with the overall objectives of TEEAM.
- To collect, collate and disseminate statistical and other information relating to electrical and electronics trade, industry and services.

Words of Past & Present Presidents of TEEAM

Mr Suresh Kumar J Gorasia (Term: 1993-1995) In line with the government's call for racial harmony in the 70's, I was invited by Mr Lim Yok Kee in 1983 to join this esteemed organisation to reflect its status as a multiracial NGO. The formation of the Federal Territory led to the change of our organisation to Selangor and Federal Territory Electrical Association. I became the first non-Chinese President in 1993. During my term, TEEAM members participated in an international electrical trade exhibition which was graced by the former PM Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad.





YB Dato' Ir Donald Lim Siang Chai (Term: 1995-2001)
I joined The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia,
TEEAM, in the year 1983 when Dr K K Lim was President,
noticing that the association had transformed itself from previously
just a recreational club to a professional body. At the moment,
the Ministry of Finance also invites TEEAM to present their
views of the industry, so as to help the country in our economic
transformation and enhance our economy in the country.

Ir Chew Shee Fuee (Term: 2001-2005) Our association is broadly divided into 3 groups: Engineering Construction and Service, Trading, and Manufacturing. Mr Lim Yok Kee, President of the association in 1987, was instrumental in consolidating the associations in various states into one national association.





Dato' Ir Lee Peng Joo (Term: 2005-2009) TEEAM is also member to both ASEAN and Asia Pacific trade organisations since 1973. In 1988, Ir G H Liew was the first Malaysian to become President of AFEEC. During my term, I initiated the implementation of reorganising AFEEC activities making it relevant to our changing times.

Our Past President, the late Mr Toh Kek Yam's immense contribution at the helm for 20 years had set the bar for Past Presidents like Dr K K Lim, Mr Lim Yok Kee and Ir G H Liew who continued to transform the association to what it is today. 60 Years of TEEAM

1952 – Development of the Association


1952, the Selangor Electrical Engineering Association (SEEA) was established. With the end of the Second World War and the liberation of Malaya, the electrical trade grew and prospered with increasing demands for electrical goods. At that juncture a growing number of far-sighted traders in the electrical sector advocated the formation of an association. The purpose of forming an association was to promote unity in this sector and to look after their welfare. With the fast advancement of the electrical sector, it was felt that no progress would be possible without fostering closer ties and the exchange of ideas among the fellow traders and contractors.

The evening of 25th July 1952 witnessed a get-together among electrical suppliers and contractors held at the premises of the Commercial Employees Guild. It was on the initiative of Messrs. Phang Wai Ng, J.P., Hooi Fook Sing, Lum Choon, Chan Kit Cheong and many others who met to start an association. At this meeting, a Pro tem Committee of 31 members was formed and the late Mr. Lee Hon Cheong was elected the Chairman. The first meeting of the Pro tem Committee was held on 3rd August 1952 to make preparation for the drafting of the constitution and to look for a suitable premises. On 15th September the same year, a meeting of the Pro tem Committee passed a resolution to rent the top floor of the building at No. E-107, Pudu Road, Kuala Lumpur, to serve as the premises for the proposed association. A campaign was launched simultaneously to raise funds and to recruit The membership drive was received with overwhelming enthusiasm. On 21st March 1953, the association convened its first Annual General Meeting. association then registered a membership of 44 members.

The association formation was celebrated with a grand dinner. The jubilation of the participants and their impressive turnout made that evening a very memorable one. The Registrar of Societies approved its registration on 25th September 1953,

thus giving birth to the Selangor Electrical Engineering Association. Mr Chan Tuck Chee was elected the first President.

1954 - The Association's Premises

On the New Year 's Day of 1954, the association's premises was officially launched by the General Manager of the Central Electricity Board (C.E.B.). Present to witness the occasion were senior officers of the C.E.B. and various commercial firms,

community leaders, representatives of associations and guilds. From then on, the Selangor Electrical Engineering Association carried out its activities as an official and legal body.

The association grew from strength to strength under


the able management of the successive committees. In 1955 with an increase in membership, the association's premises was found inadequate. It also coincided with the expiry of the tenancy. The association then decided to rent a new premises on the 3rd floor of the Lee Clansmen's Association at No. 57, Kampung Dollah Road, Off Pudu Road, Kuala Lumpur. This new premises was spacious enough for members to carry out a wide range of physical recreation and leisure activities after office hours, including a musical band.



With the attainment of independence of the country in 1957, the association reached new heights with an increase in the recruitment of outstation members. On 1st December that

year, a General Meeting passed a resolution to elevate the association to national level with a set-up called the Federation of Electrical Engineering Association. A 9-man Sub-Committee was elected to look into the registration of the new body. In early 1958, the association was told by the Registrar that the word "Chinese" should be included in the name. Repeated appeals to the Registrar not to include the word "Chinese" yielded no results. The association finally

agreed to change its name to The Chinese Electrical E n g i n e e r i n g A s s o c i a t i o n, Federation of Malaya. The association's name was subsequently approved in July 1958.



to assist in the management of its affairs. These were: Technical Sub-Committee, Welfare Sub-Committee, Recreation Sub-Committee, Sports Sub-Committee and Publication Sub-Committee.

1963 - Our Building Fund

In a special meeting held in July 1963, members supported the idea of having its own premises. A Building Committee was formed with Mr Phang Wai Ng, J.P. as Chairman. He was given the responsibility of raising funds for this project. A fundraising campaign was launched and it drew instantaneous and generous support from its members. Support also came from outstation non-members. In August that same year, the association acquired a 3-storey shophouse as

the new headquarters, at No. 91, Sungai Besi Road, Kuala Lumpur.

Later, at a General Meeting in 1970, it was resolved that the association needed to look for a bigger new premises. It was necessary due to the expanding membership and the need for more space. The old premises was sold to Messrs. Lee Seng Kwang Electrical (M) Sdn Bhd at a price of \$125,000. A new premises was acquired at a cost of \$170,000. This is our present premises located at No. 5, Jalan Gelugor, Off Jalan Kenanga, 55200 Kuala Lumpur. It was officially opened on 9th September 1973.

That year, the association's rules and regulations were amended. Consideration was given to keep abreast with the government's policy of fostering goodwill and harmony. This new policy of the association allowed people of all races to be members. In line with this, the association reverted back to its former name of the Selangor Electrical Engineering Association (SEEA).

After the formation of the Federal Territory in the 70's, the association once again changed its name. It was called the Selangor and Federal Territory Electrical Association (SAFTEA).

The constitution of the association was amended several times to cater for the expansion of the activities undertaken. One of the changes allows the association to widen its representation and promote unity amongst all races.

1977 – Growing from Strength to Strength

In 1977, the association championed for the rights and interests of its members more vigorously. Several important dialogues and negotiations were held. For example, in 1977, discussions were held with the Deputy Minister of Works and Utilities, Public Works Department and National Electricity Board. The discussions pursued the cancellation of unreasonable regulations and implementations imposed on electrical contractors. From 1978 to 1979, dialogues were held with 9 cable manufacturers in Malaysia, to resolve the problem of non supply of cables by the cable manufacturers to their customers due to bad debts.

Since 1979, the association has contributed its share in regional and international cooperation to the formation and activities of the Asean Federation of Electrical Engineering Contractors (AFEEC). TEEAM together with AKLI Indonesia, SECA Singapore, SPECS Philippines and TEMCA Thailand are the founding members of AFEEC.

In the 80's – Towards Specialisation

Anniversary. During the celebration, the pioneers who had shouldered all the hardships to establish the association were duly recognised. The association had certainly lived up to its expectation. The achievements of the association were attributed to the wise leadership of previous office bearers and the support and cooperation of its members. The amendment of the constitution of the

association in 1983 was another significant milestone, which established three groups to look into the respective interests and concern of its members in different sectors. From then on, all the members would carry out their activities under these three specialised groups, that is the Electrical Construction & Services Group, the Electrical Trading Group and the Electrical Manufacturing Group.

TEEAM was entrusted to develop standards for E&E products and services with the appointment as Standard Writing Organisation (SWO) on 20th August 1999.

1986 was the beginning of a new era for the electrical contractors in the Asian and Pacific region where FAPECA (Federation of Asian Pacific Electrical Contractors Associations) was born. TEEAM through AFEEC became a part of FAPECA. In this bigger spectrum umbrella, TEEAM expanded ties with Korea, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, United States and Hawaii.

Merger of SAFTEA & TEAM

There was an existing association called the

Federation of Electrical Associations of Malaysia (FEAM) consisting of members from various state associations and SAFTEA was one of them. FEAM members then realised

the need to

recruit direct company members and FEAM was changed to The Electrical Association of Malaysia (TEAM). Both TEAM and SAFTEA had literally the same committee members, and more or less carrying out

the same activities. With a need to have a stronger national association, it was proposed to merge these two associations into one, thus forming a national association to bring the members of the electrical and electronics sectors under one umbrella. In order to merge the two associations, TEAM was eventually dissolved and SAFTEA changed its name to The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM) on 29th October 1988. All members of TEAM were registered as TEEAM members.

The association continued excel through the years in its effort to improve its standards for the industry. In 1984, electrical courses were conducted electricians produce a higher level of skilled personnel for the Malaysian electrical

industry.

Another significant event in 1989 was TEEAM's participation in an exhibition held

in conjunction with the historical meet of the Commonwealth Heads of Government in Kuala Lumpur. The exhibition themed "Understanding Malaysia" was organised by MITI to give our guests an understanding of the economic and social achievements of Malaysia as well as the business and investment opportunities available here.

In the 90's – Overseas Trade Missions

TEEAM began to organise overseas trade missions to explore business opportunities for members. The two notable missions were to Hannover Fair and Frankfurt Lighting Fair in 1990. The 20 odd members had very good business meetings with our counterparts from Germany. They also had the opportunity to visit the well-known Hannover Fair which boasted very spacious exhibition halls that took days to finish visiting. The exhibits on display back then were very impressive and advanced. TEEAM also organised a sizeable trade delegation to India's Elecrama exhibition in 1999.

TEEAM Today

TEEAM is now accredited by the Energy Commission formerly known as the Department of Electricity and Gas Supply, to conduct wiremen training courses. Besides this TEEAM also runs a building wiring installer course which is accredited and sponsored by the Construction Industry Development Board.

It is represented in government bodies such as the National Vocational Training Council and Technical Committees of SIRIM. Our association is appointed as a Standard Writing Organisation to draft standards for electrical and electronics products and services. We are also represented at many industry dialogues and meetings with the government. TEEAM also provides information and guidance pertaining to matters related to the electrical and electronics industry through the publication of "Suara TEEAM" newsletter and members directory. The Suara is distributed locally and overseas quarterly.

The association also offers academic excellence awards and scholarships to the children of its members and their employees. Scholarships were also offered to two scholars to pursue their Bachelor Degree in E & E Engineering in local universities. TEEAM also gave recognitions in terms of book prizes to local undergraduates pursuing their degrees in E & E Engineering.

Recreational and sports activities, such as golf, badminton, bowling and jogathon are organised yearly to promote fellowship among members. The latest to add to the list of games was table tennis. An inaugural treasure hunt was successfully held in 2011 with an overwhelming 100 over participants.

TEEAM also took part in international lighting forum and is now a member of the International Commission Illumination (CIE). Malaysia working committee MyCIE and the committee challenges to become the "Centre of Excellence for Light and Lightings" in the Asean region in the future Malaysia is the first national committee that joins as a country representative this region.

TEEAM regularly received guests from trade organisation overseas to discuss economic cooperation and business collaboration. Representatives from World Bank and the Asean Secretariat have also visited the association to discuss issues of mutual interest.

Over the years, TEEAM has successfully built a good image and is well

recognised by the government and the private professional bodies and trade organisations. Under the guidance of our dynamic leaders, TEEAM is moving forward amassing greater support and participation in government's policy formulation, regulations and standards development.








1989 July – 1989 December In line with the association's name change, it was then renamed to "Suara TEEAM" and printed in English only.




