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Message from the Minister of International Trade and Industry

I wish to congratulate The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM) on its 70th Anniversary. Since its establishment in 1952, TEEAM has played a crucial role in representing the Electrical and Electronics (E&E) industry in Malaysia, working closely with the Government and key stakeholders to contribute to the successful development and promotion of Malaysia's E&E industry.

TEEAM's effort has also contributed towards positioning E&E as a significant contributor to Malaysia's economic growth, investments, export earnings, and employment, all of which play a vital role in the country's development. Most importantly, within this established eco-system, many of our local companies have successfully become part of the global value chain. This has helped develop our home-grown firms to provide world-class products and services that fulfil the requirement of MNCs, especially internationally.

From January to September 2022, the E&E industry recorded approved investments of RM22.5 billion, which is expected to generate close to 27,000 new jobs, including skilled positions such as engineers and technicians. FDI and DDI accounted for 94.7% and 5.3%, respectively, of total approved investments in the industry. E&E products also contributed 37.9% or RM438.5 billion towards Malaysia's total exports.

Under the Twelfth Malaysia Plan (12MP), the E&E industry is targeted to contribute RM120 billion to Malaysia's GDP in 2025, compared to RM86.1 billion in 2020.

TEEAM's 70th Anniversary theme, "Powering the Nation's Growth", reflects the 12MP's focus on spurring growth. Although this will be a challenge, particularly as we face the prospects of a slowing global economy in 2023, I am confident that there are bright sparks that TEEAM members can capitalise on. To that end, as TEEAM has always been an important bridge between MITI and the industry, I hope TEEAM will continue to work with us in building the resilience of our E&E segment so that it can grow more sustainably well into the future.

Again, my heartiest congratulations to TEEAM on their Platinum Jubilee 70th Anniversary.

Message from President of The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia

About TEEAM



The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM) is a representative body of the electrical and electronics industries in Malaysia. It aims to work closely with all government departments, statutory bodies and the private sector to ensure and promote orderly growth and development of the electrical and electronics industries.

By the end of the second world war and the liberation of Malaya, the electrical trade grew and prospered with increasing demands for electrical goods. Yet, price cutting and misunderstanding amongst the electrical contractors were very common.

In 1952, a group of electrical suppliers and contractors, including Late Mr. Phang Wai Ng, J.P., Mr Hooi Fook Sing, Mr Lum Choon and Mr. Chan Kit Cheong, saw the need for an association to foster closer ties and co-operation within the industry, and to ensure progress and advancement of the electrical sector. A Pro-Tem Committee of 31 members was formed, with the late Mr Lee Hon Cheong elected as its first Chairman, to make the necessary preparation for an association - The Selangor Electrical Engineering Association.

With the attainment of independence of the country in 1957, the Association reached new heights in terms of member recruitment, as many electrical contractors and electricians from out-station expressed their desire to support and join the Association. Furthermore, it was considered that a central body for all electrical contractors and electricians in Malaya would be appropriate to represent a common interest. Therefore, the Association passed a resolution to elevate itself to the national level with a set-up called the Federation of Electrical Engineering Association.

Unfortunately, the name was not accepted by the Registrar of Societies who insisted that the word "Chinese" should be included

in the name. After repeated futile appeals, the Association finally agreed to change its name to : The Chinese Electrical Engineering Association, Federation of Malaya, in 1958.

In the early 70's, the Government called for social harmony and the fostering of goodwill amongst all races. Therefore, the Association amended its Rules and Regulations in 1973, to allow people of all races to be members. In line with this, it was also then agreed that the Association revert back to its former name of The Selangor Electrical Engineering Association (SEEA). After the formation of the Federal Territory, the Association once again changed its name to Selangor and Federal Territory Electrical Association (SAFTEA).

At that point in time, there was an existing association called the Federation of Electrical Associations of Malaysia (FEAM) consisting of members from various state associations and SAFTEA was one of them. FEAM members then realised the need to recruit direct company members, and FEAM was changed to The Electrical Association of Malaysia (TEAM). Both TEAM and SAFTEA had the same committee members and were more or less carrying out the same activities.

With the need for a stronger national association, a merger of these two associations into one was proposed, thus forming a national association to bring the members of the electrical and electronics sectors under one umbrella. In order to merge the two associations, TEAM was eventually dissolved, and SAFTEA changed its name to The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM), on 29th October 1988.

Great leaders inspire greatness and instil values beyond their times. We pay tribute to our former Presidents for their wise leadership, relentless efforts and unwavering determination in driving our association forward, making TEEAM a prominent and well-respected trade association in the region.

As our Association celebrates our 70th Anniversary, we would like to honour and praise the longest-serving president in our history - the late Mr. Toh Kek Yam - he faithfully served at the helm of the Association for nearly 20 years of the 56 years he lived.

A praiseworthy visionary, the late Mr Toh had the keen foresight to establish Malaysia's E&E sector's standing in ASEAN and beyond; he was the catalyst in the formation of the ASEAN Federation of Electrical Engineering Contractors (AFEEC), in 1979.

His contribution to Malaysia's electrical industry and our association is paramount. In 1963, he appointed a Fund-Raising Committee to raise money to acquire a 3-storey shophouse as our new headquarters located at 91, Sungai Besi Road, Kuala Lumpur.

Ten years later in 1973, our Association moved into our own building at 5-B, Jalan Gelugor, Off Jalan Kenanga, Kuala Lumpur, where our current office is now located. In response to the Government's call for social harmony and fostering of goodwill amongst all races, the Association duly amended its Rules and Regulations to allow people of all races to be members in the very same year.

Amongst our various contributions towards Malaysia's growth include our appointment as Standards Writing Organisation (SWO) for electrical and electronics products/services, representative seating in various Technical Committees/Working Groups, and also our representation in the ASEAN Consultative Committee for Standards & Quality (ACCSQ) Joint Sectoral Committee on Electrical & Electronics Equipment (JSC EEE).

Furthermore, we are committed to developing talents for our industry as we are also accredited by the Energy Commission, formerly known as the Department of Electricity and Gas Supply, to conduct Wiremen Training Courses, and a Building Wiring Installer Course - both accredited and sponsored by the Construction Industry Development Board Malaysia (CIDB).

In a collaborative effort to develop and grow the Mechanical and Electrical industry at large, TEEAM is the founding member of the Malaysia Council of Mechanical & Electrical

Associations (MCMEA) and a member of the Machinery & Engineering Industries Federation (MEIF).

Geographically-speaking, Malaysia is at the centre of ASEAN, and TEEAM is pivotal in establishing and maintaining Malaysia's professional standing in the E&E sector in ASEAN and beyond.

Since 1979, the Association has contributed its share in regional and international co-operation to the formation and activities of the ASEAN Federation of Electrical Engineering Contractors (AFEEC). TEEAM, together with AKLI Indonesia, SECA Singapore, SPECS Philippines and TEMCA Thailand, are the founding members of AFEEC. TEEAM, through AFEEC, became a part of FAPECA. In this bigger spectrum umbrella, TEEAM signed Memorandum of Understanding with international counterparts in Thailand, China, Korea, India, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Singapore, Indonesia and the Philippines, to promote cross-border trade between members.

Through our local and international contacts, we frequently organise Seminars and Technical Visits to keep our members abreast with new technology and industry best practices. From these and other Sports and Recreational Activities, TEEAM also pro-actively fosters friendships, builds networks and at the same time, create win-wins trade and business opportunities for our members and Malaysia.

TEEAM and the Community

While promoting the orderly growth and development of the Electrical and Electronics industries, TEEAM also has the community in which its members operate close to its heart, specifically on areas concerning public electrical safety and sustainability of the industries. Major campaigns in recent years include :

Electronics Waste (EW), Compact Fluorescent Lamp (CFL) & Fluorescent Lamp (FL) Recycling Programme

At the turn of the new millennium, Compact Fluorescent Lamps (CFLs) had gained popularity amongst consumers for their high light-efficiency, low power consumption and relatively long service life. However, due to the use of mercury in lamp production and the unavailability of recycling facilities, CFLs are polluting our environment. Most people were uninformed and treated the CFLs as regular incandescent lamps, therefore they discarded the lamp as common waste.

In 2013, TEEAM embarked on Phase 1 of this project, funded by The GEF Small Grants Programme implemented by the United Nations Development Programme, to educate the public on the proper disposal of used CFLs. During Phase 2, TEEAM set up collection bins in designated shopping malls and trader outlets for the public to send used CFLs as well as Fluorescent Lamps (FLs) for recycling by an appointed recycling contractor for proper disposal.

For the final Phase 3 which ended in 2019, TEEAM collaborated with the Malaysia International Commission of Illumination (MyCIE), and expanded the recycling programme to include Electronics Waste (E-Waste). Used and discarded electrical & electronic appliances and components including batteries are commonly known as E-Waste. They contain harmful substances such as mercury, lead, cadmium, nickel, lithium, chromium, etc. E-waste, if disposed of in landfills, can cause the hazardous metals and materials that can contaminate our soil, water and air. Hence, TEEAM took the lead in raising environmental awareness and facilitating the collection, storage and disposal of these E-waste through organising roadshows at workplaces, malls and schools to educate the public.



Self-Test RCCB Nationwide Safety Campaign

Since 2014, TEEAM has been proactively raising awareness among the general public on the need for regular self-testing of RCCBs to prevent hazards such as electric shocks and electrocution. To date, nineteen nationwide TEEAM Safety Awareness Roadshows have been successfully conducted in shopping malls, campuses and also in residential areas. The Roadshows provided a good platform to successfully reach out to the set target of one million people in Malaysia, in order for them to understand the importance of RCCB self-testing electrical safety procedures at home.

These campaigns included Public Service Announcements (PSAs) on radio and have received wide media coverage from TV2, NTV 7, 988 fm, New Straits Times, Sin Chew Daily, China Press, Nanyang Siang Pau, Oriental Daily and others, on this crucial life-saving programmes for the masses.

TEEAM has always been supportive of those affected by natural disasters such as the floods in Selangor and Pahang in 2021. We urgently collected donations and contributions from our members and collaborated with the Junior Chamber International Kuala Lumpur (JCI KLM) to provide much-needed flood relief to the residents of Taman Chegar Medang and Kampung Chamang in Bentong, Pahang while also channelling cash donations to the Tzu Chi Flood Charity Fund. TEEAM has also donated aids directly to flood victims of Kampung Bahru HICOM, Shah Alam, through their local Community Pro-tem Committee.

Moving forward, TEEAM will continue our gallant efforts to proactively promote and spread the crucial life-saving message regarding electrical safety and relevant sustainability topics, to the general public.
